The work done by our Midweek Muckers, North & Southern Groups, Gift Shop & Visitor Centre Teams and all the others of you that help with our conservation work, and/or in the office is vital to MWT. We have some fantastic groups who are all doing amazing things. Thank you!

I've been fortunate that in my career to date, as I've worked with large teams of volunteers in horticultural colleges, botanical gardens and zoos and wildlife parks. More amazing and passionate people who care strongly about nature and conservation, as I know you all do.

Based on my previous experiences, there are some things we are now looking to implement within MWT, that will hopefully better showcase your contribution, allow more people to volunteer with us, allow you all to make an even greater positive impact for nature, and make it clearer to the Island what being an MWT Volunteer means. We/I do not want to do anything to harm the wonderful groups/culture we already have, but instead look at ways we can perhaps learn from each other, and link up more for a greater gain:

• Many of you will know that we have a MWT Volunteer Coordinator (Sarah Hickey). The funding for this post was achieved by my predecessor, Tim Graham, and I'm delighted how Sarah is developing in this role. Sarah has oversight across all our volunteers and it is her function to organise MWT approaches, systems and processes if/when appropriate.

Sarah will be engaging with all our volunteers and volunteer groups in the coming months – please reach out to her with anything to do with volunteering with us.

- Sarah has written a generic MWT Volunteer Handbook. This will be distributed to all present and future volunteers. Existing handbooks (for e.g. the Muckers or Gift Shop) will remain as separate sections, with your specific information but will also hold the generic information in the one handbook.
- Sarah has produced a spreadsheet (soon to be a database) of all our volunteers. To help her get this up-todate we are asking all existing volunteers to check and if necessary provide new information. We'd be grateful if you could provide that for Sarah when requested.





• We have been granted 12 months funding from the Manx Lottery Trust to employ Rachael Harrop (Rey) for 2 days a week in a role to support our three visitor centres and retail outlets (Ayres, Peel and Scarlett). Rey will be available to assist with all aspects

of the work across our 3 centres and also develop joint messaging, signage and systems as appropriate. I encourage volunteers to make good use of her boundless enthusiasm and talents!

• We re-launched our MWT Volunteer Awards this year and have received nominations for some amazing people/ contributions. All our volunteers and the contributions you make are amazing, but these awards are an opportunity for MWT to recognise particular excellence 'above and beyond'. We hope they become a part of MWT Volunteering culture for years ahead.

## Muckers

Work parties do not take place on the reserve during bird nesting season but some necessary repairs to paths and boardwalks were undertaken. Special thanks to Guy and Janet Thompson for some of these. Sheila Norris continued her dedicated work of recording species on the site and, with some guidance from Tricia Sayle, kept an eye open for any urgent maintenance work that was required. Unfortunately brambles do not obey lock down restrictions and keeping the paths clear of overhanging brambles and nettles is a constant task at this time of year.

Three enthusiastic ladies have recently volunteered to help maintain and develop Earystane Reserve. Cheryl Callister had the idea of "adopting" Earystane, and Southern Group Committee were delighted to meet her and look forward to working together.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> July Ian and Carrie Costain opened to the public their delightful and interesting cottage garden near Fistard. This was in aid of MWT and was the sole survivor of a "Gardening for Wildlife" weekend which Southern Group had planned before COVID-19 struck. The first thought was to hold them over to next year, but this proved impossible especially with the very dry weather in April/May so.... Ian got going on Facebook and with Manx Plant and Garden Conservation Society to sell from an online list with call and collect by appointment. Joe kept potting on and splitting so the plant numbers kept increasing to supply demand! Over £2,300 worth of plants have been sold: more than the plant sales at last year's Fair! also "recruited" a satellite group of 6 "growers" who will grow plants/ take cuttings for next year's Fair.

# **Calf of Man**



Our wardens are now back on the calf and busy ringing birds and surveying a range of wildlife, from lizards to seals. We will shortly be looking for volunteers to help with a wide variety of jobs, ideally for an extended period but we will consider all offers! If you're interested in learning new skills or using existing ones in this unique environment, please get in touch.

For eight weeks every autumn, Manx Wildlife Trust (MWT) sends volunteers to the Calf of Man to conduct seal surveys, to monitor the number of births and take a photographic record of adults, with the aim of better understanding the Isle of Man's seal population. The surveys start mid-September, to enable the survey to capture information about the pups and adult seals. Manx

Wildlife Trust is looking for an enthusiastic volunteer to part-take in the whole survey period and the following 2 weeks to complete the data analysis. This is an exciting opportunity to study these unique mammals for someone already with or wanting to develop their photo ID skills.

The role will be based at the Calf of Man Bird Observatory for 8 weeks and then 2 weeks on the Isle of Man. Availability needs to be flexible, as the boat trips on/off the Calf of Man are very weather dependent. Shorter periods would be considered based on experience.

Tasks may include:

- Daily visits to pupping sights to count the number of births
- Photographing each pup with its mother (and all adult seals) and comparing photos with our existing photo
  - ID catalogue
- Recording the developmental stage of the seal pup
- Monitoring mortality rate of the pups

Ideally experience in photo ID of seals would be preferable but training can be provided. Applicants must be comfortable walking 4 miles a day on variable terrain.

There is some support for this role. Accommodation will be provided on the Calf of Man and a £30 per week food allowance will also be provided.
