



## Action for Wildlife: Woodland Ark

What is it?

The 'Woodland Ark' is a project to save the Isle of Man's most endangered woodland wildflowers by creating and managing a special site at the Ramsey Hairpin.

Why do we need help?

We need a primary sponsor for this project to fund the ongoing horticultural growing of rare native plants, their introduction to site and the establishment of traditional woodland management. This will take six years.

Is it sustainable?

Yes. Once the traditional management is established after six years it will become self-financing through woodland products and be managed through community involvement.

What does the sponsor get?

The sponsor will have the primary 'supported by' message on web communications, on site communications and in social media messaging. The sponsoring organisation will also have repeated opportunities for corporate volunteering and events. Manx Wildlife Trust will work with the sponsoring organisation to involve them in more imaginative ways such as HQ woodland

wildflower uplifts, natural artwork and social events

such as 'walking stick workshops'.

What is needed?

This project requires £4,000 per annum for up to six years to reach its sustainable management point
