

## CURRENT COLLECTIONS CARE PROJECTS


- Rehousing the entomology collection
  - 78,000 specimens mounted on pins
  - £16,000 raised in grant funding to purchase 10 cabinets
  - Deaccessioning non-Manx material
  - Repinning and repair of damaged material

## WHY ARE COLLECTIONS IMPORTANT?

There are millions of specimens in museums throughout the world, but regional collections in particular represent their locality better than anywhere else – we are important.

Museum collections are made to facilitate environmental research in a changing world. They are a key hub connecting some of the most pressing issues of our time, like the biodiversity and climate crisis.

Natural history collections are a rich repository of data about the individual animal and the environment it experienced while it was alive, helping us track the impacts of change.

If a local environment no longer exists, museum specimens become a unique and irreplaceable archive. This reference material contributes to the conservation and restoration of our environment.
